## Salisbury State School 2017 Homework Policy

The Homework Policy for Salisbury State School has been developed according to Education Queensland Guidelines in consultation with the Whole School Community.

## According to synthesis of current research (eg John Hattie) Homework works best when it:

- is clearly related to class work
- does NOT require children to engage in "rote" learning (eg writing out spelling lists)
- is helps make parents and family aware of what is being learnt in class
- is purposeful & relevant to needs/capabilities of the student (ie is differentiated where needed)
- is appropriate for that particular phase of learning (eg Prep VS Year 6)
- is monitored by the class teacher with a focus on feedback to students
- develops a pattern of behaviour for life-long learning, leading into the demands of High School
- helps develop independence as a learner through extension activities such as investigating, researching, writing, designing and making
- assists students to prepare for upcoming classroom learning, such as collecting relevant materials and information, completing surveys and audits

## **Guidelines for Parents and Teachers**

- 1. Parents are required to sign the Reading Log each day. Bedtime stories and structured school readers are both recommended, as is a range of authors and text types.
- 2. Differentiation of tasks should occur for students as required and can be negotiated with the classroom teacher. Homework, like learning, needs to be personalised.
- 3. In Years 5 and 6, Teachers will provide an electronic copy of homework for parents on the e-mail list as well as hardcopy for students
- 4. Any set Homework will be timed in such a way to allow families flexibility to complete some tasks over the weekend.
