**Under this agreement for 2020
Salisbury State School will receive**

\$107,448*

This funding will be used to

- The school will enter PBL Tier 2 in 2021 on the strength of the consistent practices across the school, as required by the EBS and SET data in particular.
- A reduction of 50% of major behaviour incidents will be achieved on a monthly basis by December 2020.
- School Opinion Survey (2020/21) results will reflect an improved response (+25%) to "Is behaviour well managed at this school", in all 3 groups surveyed (Staff/Students/Parents).

Our initiatives include

- Engage a school leader to co-ordinate and deliver the school's PBL (Positive Behaviour for Learning) Action Plan alongside the BSEM (Berry Street Education Model) frameworks. Key senior staff will collaborate with this leadership role to drive improvements in these areas.
- Provide TRS and other opportunities to address behaviour processes and consistent management strategies in the classroom. An emphasis on teaching replacement behaviours and proactive self-regulation will exist.
- Improve the consistent recording and reporting of behavioural concerns across the school, resulting in authentic and accurate event records and school wide data.
- Engage the community in understanding the processes, policies and strategies of PBL and BSEM.

Our school will improve student outcomes by

Engage a school leader to co-ordinate and deliver the school PBL Action Plan and BSEM Framework.	100,000
Provide TRS to staff for the purpose of collaboration with the appointed school leader. This is used to ensure consistent practices and debrief and functional analysis of behavioural incidents.	5,000
Provide additional resources for teaching the self-regulation strategies that are an essential part of the BSEM framework.	2,448
