Prep at Salisbury State School

In Prep, students are provided with spacious and engaging learning areas that have been developed with early learners in mind. Areas for small group activities, whole class learning and play based learning features in each classroom. Our Prep teachers have been selected for their passion for early years education and their extensive experience in Kindergartens and Early Years Learning centres. The Prep curriculum is crafted to blend play-based learning with technology and curriculum programs to maximise the development of the whole child and deliver high academic outcomes. Our students are supported in their learning by their classroom teachers, a full time Prep teacher aide and our student support team that are committed to support and extend every student.

A Typical Day in the Life of a Salisbury Prep

1st Session

- Good morning and welcome
- Acknowledgement of Country
- Brain break and fruit snack
- Literacy Based Activities including oral language, synthetic phonics approach, explicit reading and writing lessons.
- 1st Break

2nd Session

- Numeracy Based Activities including small group and whole class learning, games and hands-on experiences
- 2nd Break

3rd Session

Arts, Technologies or Health.

*students also participate in specialist lessons for Music, Physical Education lessons during the week.



What happens during lunch?

During lunch breaks, the Prep children sit together in the eating area, as a group for 10 minutes. They are encouraged to eat at this time and are assisted to make healthy choices and to open tricky containers and packaging.

After 10 minutes, it's playtime! The junior school (Prep—Year 2) play together in the junior playground. At the start of the year, school leaders engage with the Preps to encourage and assist them to play organized games. Sporting equipment is added to supplement the fixed equipment in the playground.

Prep students are able to participate in a number of lunchtime activities/clubs including chess, games and lego, robotics, gardening, drawing and sustainability club.
